## Ahlan wa sahlan – Welcome Back The new school semester begins at the AES

Samir Esaid, the founder of the school, reported on March 14, 2021:

The second half of the school year began on February 8, 2021. Everyone was happy that the days of home schooling were over and that we could go back to school. The pupils should arrive in three stages. By March 7th, everyone would have been there in full. But that wasn't possible. Two weeks after the first group of students, the number of people infected with corona doubled due to the new arrivals. So their return to school had to be stopped.

Now the school is trying again to give distance learning. Distance learning is particularly difficult for the blind and visually impaired because the technical prerequisites for it are often lacking. The blind teachers therefore try to support the pupils wherever possible and to make learning easier for them. After the number of those affected by the epidemic rose daily from 700 to around 5,000 and the number of daily shop opening hours was reduced, it was decided at the end of February to close the school and even the churches completely on Fridays after five weeks.

The economic situation in Jordan is deteriorating daily due to the closure of many companies. Statistics show that 24 percent of Jordanians have become unemployed. 400,000 people have lost their jobs as a result of the epidemic. Short-time working is not included here.

Since only a small number of parents continue to pay school fees despite the school closings, the school loses considerable amounts of school fees. This is unlikely to change in the coming school year.

As only a few vaccines have arrived in Jordan so far, unfortunately only a small number of people have been vaccinated.

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Hundreds of thousands of people are still waiting to be vaccinated. My parents, both over 82 years old, are also affected. My mother has now been vaccinated, but my father is still waiting for his turn. Doctors and nurses had priority in Jordan.

We pray to the Lord to help us in this catastrophe that has hit the whole world, because in Jordan, as everywhere in the world, we have lost many people to this epidemic. We now have around 450,000 infected people and almost 5,000 deaths. Six patients have just died in a hospital near Amman because the clinic ran out of oxygen.

### School starts in the second half of the year, corona tests



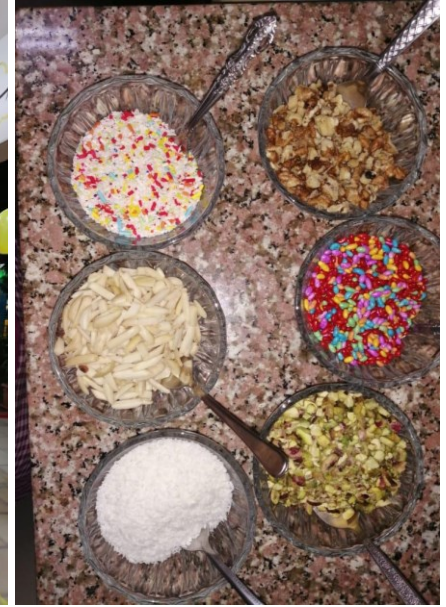
The first day of the second half of the school year began with the lighting of thank you candles in church. These are an expression of the request to God Almighty to look after and accompany the children and their safe return to school. We are grateful for God's blessings, also in school.



At the beginning of the second half of the school year, the epidemiological investigation team from the Ministry of Health came and tested all employees for Corona. A medical team from the Caritas Jordan Association tested the students at the Arab Episcopal School. Respect and thanks to Caritas! In the meantime, all employees as well as the children are experienced in handling all corona protective measures.

The last few months have been characterized by numerous advanced training courses on distance learning and home schooling. The teachers took up the new challenge constructively.

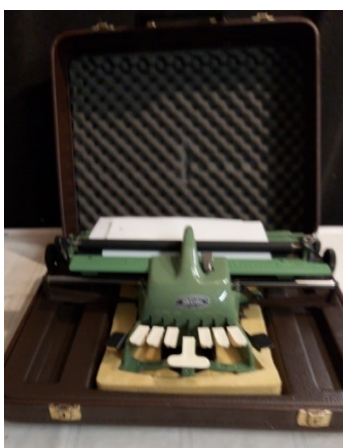


They were motivated in the strategic plans to "activate distance learning".

They usually brought such devices with them in their luggage as gifts to the school. We hope that one day we can deliver our Braille typewriters to Irbid.

So you, dear readers, can cheerfully continue donating. The corona-plagued AES can use support!

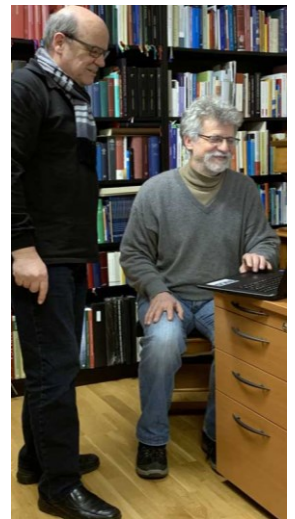
